See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.

See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you,

because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near;

let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts;

let them return to the Lord, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord.

For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

Gospel: Luke 13: 1-9

At that very time there were some present who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, 'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

Then he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vine-yard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, "See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" He replied, "Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig round it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

Yellow Gift Aid Envelope Each week there are a number of Yellow Gift Aid Envelopes that we cannot use to claim the intended enhanced giving of 20%, as the detail boxes have not been completed by the donor. It is vital that each of the boxes on the face of the Yellow Gift Aid Envelope contain your title, full name, full address and postcode together with the date you place your giving within the envelope - without this information we are unable to claim the 20% enhancement on your giving from HM Government and the envelope used if sealed is also wasted. The intended 20% enhancement of your giving is especially welcome to assist church but is lost if you do not fully complete the detail boxes. Thank you for your assistance.

Recycling Update Your 10th box of candles has been despatched for recycling weighing 12.8 Kg meaning cumulatively 123.84 Kg has been saved from going to landfill. As well as your candles, tealights and candles in containers you can deposit for recycling your used ink cartridges, milk container tops, used and

replaced spectacles, old mobile telephones and used postage stamps. Many thanks for your support of our many recycling initiatives.

Relaunch of The St Andrews' 100 Club We are pleased to announce that The St Andrews' 100 Club is being relaunched from April 2025 with a new organising and administration team. The first prize draw being made in May and monthly thereafter. The Club year will run from April to March annually and Application Forms will be available soon in Church for you to complete. Each number will be priced at £25 per annum (the first increase for many years) and there is no limit to the number of tickets that you may purchase. It is acknowledged that this is an increase from the previous £15 ticket price (pre2024) however we feel it is more reasonable for households at this time, and is a substantial reduction on the proposal last year of £5 per month - being £60 per annum. Renewal forms will be available annually from March 2026 and are to be returned by 11 April to be included in the draws this year.

Half of the total funds raised will serve as the prize fund for the year with the remainder being funds for St Andrews' - so a good way to support the work of the Church and to take part with a chance to win back the price of your ticket.

We apologise for the inconvenience caused by the failure of the relaunch that was promoted at the APCM 2024 and which was abandoned later last year, and trust you will be able to support this renewed fundraising opportunity for Church. Thank you for your support.
